Challenging Academics

HCA employs regular evaluations of students and teachers to maintain accountability to its mission and core values. For our students, yearly standardized tests measure their relative position to national norms. For our teachers, we maintain an extensive professional development program ranging from mentor programs for new teachers to funding masters degrees.

Also, as a part of our regional and national accreditation, each core academic department undergoes a year-long evaluation and revision of its curricula in relation to national standards.

Key Metrics of Academic Success at HCA

- **Qualified Teachers:** 95% of teachers have graduated from U.S. colleges and universities.
- **National Honor Society:** In 2025, 51% of students in 10th-12th grade are NHS members having earned a GPA of 3.90 or higher.
- **Standardized Test Scores:** Graduating students score 23% higher than U.S. average. See page 15 for additional details.
- **College Readiness:** On average, graduating students score 100+ points higher on the SAT than the U.S. national average. See page 14 for additional details.




HCA provides a college preparatory caliber of education. HCA measures this achievement by measuring key college entrance exams such as the College Board SAT test. The following data represent the current results:


College Board SAT Data

Iowa Assessment Results

HCA uses the Iowa Basic and CogAt as a standardized benchmark for academic achievement. The following results represent the data from our 2025 assessment results by lower elementary, upper elementary, middle school, and high school.



The data from the standardized achievement data communicates a few key points:

- HCA builds a strong academic foundation in 1st through 3rd grade
- The strong foundation prepares for accelerated academic results culminating in results showcased in high school scores that are 23% higher than the U.S. average.
